$\sqrt{}$ = it's in scope of practice

This key indicates that the practice, technique, treatment, task, or action is within provider scope of practice. The application or task is defined as an indication within the regulated defined scope. If a profession is lacking this key, it could be due to the following:

• It is out of scope of practice

- They are not allowed to perform it
- Though professionals may have taken additional training, these applications are not covered by their regulated profession

O= they traditionally offer it safely & accurately

This key indicates that a professional performs this task, safely, accurately, and with precision. They are well versed in the task and its offered regularly in widespread by these professionals. If a profession is lacking this key, it could be due to the following:

- The application is not traditionally done/offered apart of standard care within the respective profession
- Professionals provide it, but not safely
- It may be provided but it's typically not done accurately.

Δ = taught in program

This key indicates that an application or treatment being performed is a standard that is taught within the respective regulated profession. If a profession is lacking this key, it could be due to the following:

- The treatment, technique, application isn't taught in the respective program.
- The professional learned it outside of their respective program and regulated industry; they took a CEU that allowed them to learn.

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
